PEER SUPPORT

The position entails working in the Community providing individual support and/or working at our Drop-In Centre supporting peers on different pathways to recovery and harm reduction for individuals who use substances. The Peer Support Worker helps to empower individuals to achieve their hopes, dreams, goals, and connect with them in a manner unique to having shared experiences. Through active listening and appropriate sharing of his/her own circumstances, journey and perspective, the Peer Supporter ‘walks with’ the consumer/patient/client for the duration of their relationship to support his/her journey toward recovery and wellness. The objective of intentional Peer Support is to provide a relational methodology for sharing a common experience by which ‘equals may help each other cope, thrive and flourish.

REQUIREMENTS

Candidates are required to:

- Post secondary education in a related field preferred
- Certificates in CPI/SMT, WRAP, ASIST, Emotional First Aid, CPR/First Aid
- Experience working within hospital environment, including Detox and ED Services
- Have personal lived experience with mental health and or addictions.
- Ability to provide consistent, relational support in a healthy and positive manner to others without judgement.
- Consider themselves well enough in their own journey to regularly attend work, regularly manage meetings and appointments, participate in activities and conversations regularly about mental illness, substance use and their impacts, maintain confidentiality, observe appropriate boundaries and engage in regular supervision.
- Work as part of a team but also be able to work autonomously with minimal supervision.
- Demonstrated ability to facilitate groups and provide individual one-to-one support.
- Be committed to ongoing training and development.
- Working collaboratively with other service providers.
- Demonstrate appropriate boundaries and self-awareness as well as respect for others.
- Demonstrate a satisfactory level of proficiency with computer programs (MS Word, Excel) email, cell phone and basic statistical forms.
- Attend all staff meetings, trainings and events as directed by the Peer Support Coordinator.
- Provide a recent clear Vulnerable Sector Screening.
- Possess an Ontario Driver’s License and access to a reliable vehicle as well as appropriate liability and vehicle insurance.
- Willingness to work flexible hours, up to and including weekends
